All prescription medications must be in their original prescription container with the camper's name on the prescription label. *Do not pack over the counter medications* (aspirin, cough drops, etc.). They will be provided for at the camp.

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CAMP GEAR - Items to bring to camp

Clothing - Temperatures can range from the low 80s during the day and the low 30s at night. Although there are 6 days of camp, campers often change their clothes throughout the day, depending on the temperature and weather. Please be sure to bring at least 10 days of clothes. THERE ARE NO LAUNDRY FACILITIES AT CAMP.

- Pants - Shorts
- Shirts (short and long sleeve)
- Sweatshirts
- Socks - Underwear
- Jacket - **NECESSARY**
- Footwear – Two pair are suggested, such as sneakers and boots - NO SANDALS, FLIP-FLOPS, ETC. (except for use in the showers)

Bedding - Campers will be sleeping in cabins. Each cabin is equipped with bunk beds that have springs and a 4-inch mattress. There is a heater in each cabin for nights that are cold.

- Sleeping Bag or Bedding with Blankets
- Pillows

Toiletries - Facilities are complete with showers, sinks, and toilets. Campers can bring bathing suits or swim trunks to shower in.

- Towels - 1 or 2
- Washcloth
- Brush - Comb
- Toothbrush & Toothpaste
- Soap & Shampoo
- Chap Stick
- Sunscreen
- Deodorant – Antiperspirant
- Laundry Bag

WATER BOTTLE

Although the temperature is not as hot on the mountain as in the city, it is still considered high desert. It is very important that campers stay well hydrated. Headache, nausea, & a bloody nose are just a few of the symptoms of being dehydrated and it is hard to have a great time with any of those. Any water bottle is okay, but it is important that the bottle has a sealable lid. Water bottles can be refilled at drinking fountains throughout the camp ground (cold spring mountain water!).



Electronics - Campers may bring specific electronics to camp but will do so at their own risk – PB & J and Clark County Parks are not responsible for any lost or stolen items.

There is NO cell or internet service at the 9,500 feet elevation at Lee Canyon. Video games are NOT allowed, and listening to music is allowed inside the cabins ONLY.

- Cell phone (for camera, music)
- Watch
- Flashlight with EXTRA batteries

DO NOT BRING

Do not bring the following items to camp. Any camper found with any of the following items will be sent home immediately at the parents' expense.

Illegal Drugs - Alcohol - Tobacco - Weapons - Fireworks - Lighters – Matches - Pets



Parent Day and Information

Leadership Camp is a closed camp, which means *NO visitors*. However on the last day of camp (July 9, 2019), parents will drive to Camp Lee Canyon and participate in our closing ceremonies. We invite parents to come to camp at **10:00AM**. Do NOT bring pets, as the Clark County facility does not allow them. Our closing ceremonies will begin promptly at **10:30AM**. The ceremony usually takes about 30 minutes and is full of fun and exciting memories. Parents and campers must be clear of Camp Lee no later than **12:00PM (noon)**.

Guidelines on what to bring and NOT to bring to camp

1. The temperatures can range from the low 80's during the day and low 30's at night. A jacket and warm clothes are a necessity.
2. Each participant needs a weeks' worth of clothing, including underwear, socks, pants, shorts and sweatshirts.
3. Everyone **MUST** have a water bottle with a cap on it. Even though camp is in the mountains, the air is still very dry and dehydration is always a concern.
4. Please bring prescription medication in the original bottles with the campers name on them. These will be turned over to the medical staff. Camper will keep inhalers with them.
5. **DO NOT** bring over the counter medication. Our medical staff has a supply of most needed medications such as ibuprofen, Tylenol, Benadryl and cough drops. This is not an all-inclusive list. If you have a question or concern about this, please email the staff at info@pbandjleadership.org
6. There is no need to bring money to camp.
7. *General camping necessities are:* sleeping bag, pillow, blanket, sturdy closed toe shoes (no sandals or flip flops), flashlight with extra batteries, towel, washcloth, deodorant, toothbrush with toothpaste, soap in a container, shampoo, brush, laundry bag, pajamas, boots and sneakers.
8. **DO NOT** bring food or drinks other than a water bottle. Snacks and meals are provided.
9. **DO NOT** bring fireworks, matches, lighters, two way radios, weapons or controlled substances. **DO NOT** bring video games.
10. Cameras and iPods are allowed at the risk of damage or loss. iPods will only be allowed to be used when the participants are in their bunks or cabins. (There is only 1 electrical outlet in each cabin)

To assure the safety of your child and all of our participants, it is important that we know who your child will be picked up by. Please complete this form and turn it in on the first day of camp being held at the College of Southern Nevada, Henderson campus.

When your child is picked up on July 9th, 2019 from Camp Lee, the person picking up your child must present a current State issued identification matching the information on this form. If someone besides the person on this form is picking up your child, they will need to bring an updated and signed form.

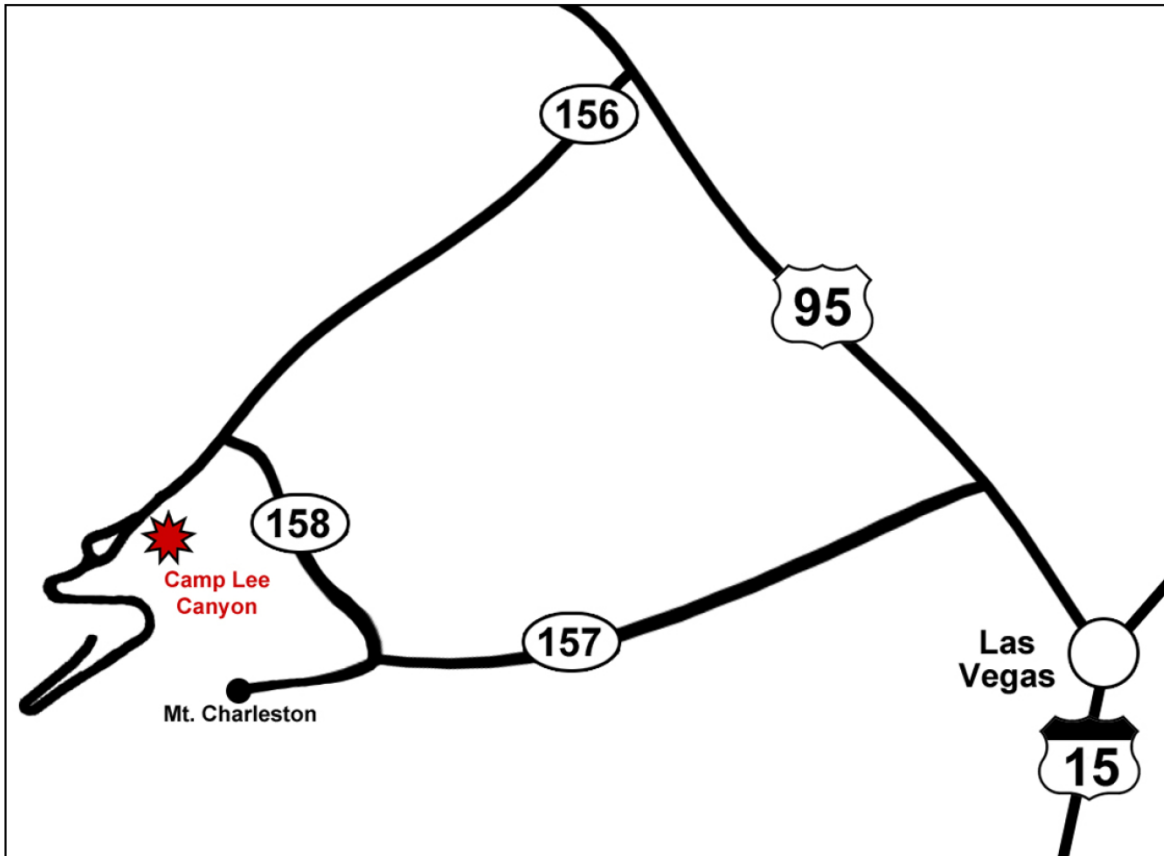

Directions to Camp Lee Canyon

Allow at least one hour of travel time from the Las Vegas area. Camp Lee Canyon is located on Lee Canyon Rd., about 45 miles northwest of Las Vegas at an elevation of over 8,000 feet. There are no gas stations or convenience stores on Mt. Charleston, so it is best to fill up before driving up the mountain. In the summer months, it is also a good idea to bring drinking water as a travel precaution. There is no cellular phone service in the camp area.

To get to Camp Lee Canyon, travel north along US 95 about 30 miles from Las Vegas. You will pass the turn off for Mt. Charleston/ Kyle Canyon (Route 157). Keep going on US 95. Turn west (left) at the Lee Canyon turn off (Lee Canyon Rd.) Stay on Lee Canyon Rd. for approximately 15 miles. On this road you will be climbing in elevation from 3,000 feet to 8,000 feet. (This part of the drive can cause overheating in older cars, so watch your temperature gauge. Turning off your air conditioner may help lower your engine temperature.)

As you travel up Lee Canyon Rd, you will pass the turn off you Route 158 and you will also pass the road for Camp Foxtail and the meadow play area. Stay on Camp Lee Rd.. Once you have passed those landmarks - you're almost there! The entrance to Camp Lee Canyon is on the left side of the road. The camp is set back off the road but is marked by signage. Turn left into the camp, just before the McWilliams campground and the Lee Canyon ski area.
